Mark The Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph

This married couple was unable to have children for a long time, but eventually had a baby girl- the Blessed Virgin Mary! They became the grandparents of Jesus.

Mark St. Anne & St. Joachim

This teacher and student helped one another grow in holiness and virtue while still having fun.

Mark St. John Bosco & St. Dominic Savio

These twin brothers were both doctors who often treated their patients for free and prayed for them when they were sick.

Mark St. Cosmas & St. Damian

These two Saints were friends who took care of the sick lepers in the Hawaiian Islands.

Mark St. Damien of Molokai and St. Marianne Cope

These two modern Saints both traveled the world extensively and met in person several times. They shared many things in common, including their devotion to the Eucharist and their work to support the dignity of every person.

Mark St. John Paul II & St. Teresa of Calcutta

These Saints were both from the same town in the country of Peru. Both became lay Dominicans and worked to help the people around them through prayer and service.

Mark St. Martin de Porres and St. Rose of Lima

This twin brother and sister went on to both found new religious orders. They met each year on their birthday, spending that time together discussing their faith and their work.

Mark St. Benedict & St. Scholastica

Both from the same town in Italy, both left lives of wealth for a new calling of poverty as they served God and his people.

Mark St. Francis of Assisi & St. Clare of Assisi

These Apostles each shared a unique mission to spread the Gospel at the very beginning of the Church. They didn't always agree, but they both used their gifts to tell the Jews and Gentiles about Jesus.

Mark St. Peter & St. Paul

This holy mother prayed for the conversion of her pagan son for years and years. He eventually turned his life to Jesus and became an influential bishop.

Mark St. Monica & St. Augustine

These brothers were two of the closest followers of Jesus and were called the Sons of Thunder.

Mark St. James & St. John

This husband and wife each owned small businesses, making lace and watches. They raised five daughters, all who entered religious life, including St. Therese of Lisieux!

Mark St. Louis & St. Zelle Martin

These friends worked together to found the Jesuit order in the 1500s and spread Christianity around the world.

Mark St. Ignatius of Loyola & St. Francis Xavier

These women were young mothers when they were arrested during a time of Christian persecution in the early 200s in Africa. They went bravely to their martyrdom with a group of believers.

Mark St. Felicity & St. Perpetua

These friends from Spain worked together to reform the Carmelite Order. They both were mystics, writers, and are Doctors of the Church.

Mark St. Teresa of Avila & St. John of the Cross

These priests from France were friends who traveled to North America to share their faith with the Native Americans. They ministered to thousands in what is today Quebec before their martyrdom.

Mark St. Isaac Jogues & St. John de Brebeuf

These Ugandan martyrs were forced to serve an evil king and chose martyrdom rather than to deny their faith. They protected each other from sin and baptized the new believers.

Mark St. Charles Lwanga & St. Kizito

Both these men were scholars who lived and wrote about monasticism, but then later became bishops and leaders in their communities. They had different opinions about solving problems, but always remained friends.

Mark St. Basil & St. Gregory

Tradition says that both of these men were followers of John the Apostle. They went on to both become bishops and corresponded through letters about issues in the early Church.

Mark St. Ignatius of Antioch and St. Polycarp

Although one was a Franciscan and one a Dominican, these priests became friends and wrote extensively about theology in the 13th century. Each became a Doctor of the Church.

Mark St. Bonaventure & St. Thomas Aquinas

These French Saints both faced many hardships. They worked together to create institutions to serve the poor and those in need. They were also friends with St. Vincent de Paul!

Mark St. Francis de Sales & St. Jane Frances de Chantal

This brother and sister saw multiple visions of the Blessed Virgin Mary near their home in Fatima, Portugal along with their cousin Lucia.
